# H-I-G-H-L-I-G-H-T-S OF MINUTES OF MARCH GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING

March 13, 2010

The meeting was called to order with 317 members present; number required for a quorum was 285.

Treasurer's Report as of February 28, 2010, was read by Tom Fisher as follows: Checking account balance \$103,037.00; reserve account balance \$103,642.00; February income \$6,880.00; February expenses \$24,708.00; net ordinary income \$17,829.00.

The Treasurer reported that the November 2009 I.R.S. audit has been satisfied and closed. According to the I.R.S. agent, the reason for the audit was that a blank form was submitted with the 2004 tax return prepared by our account, which resulted in the questions.

Jack Bradshaw, representing the Long Range Planning Committee, gave a report on the comments received from the informational meeting regarding the develop- ment of the land north of the building. The committee recommended that H.V.R. proceed with Phase I of the development (i.e. paving the parking areas) as explained at the informational meeting and requested authorization to accept bids and award contracts for the same without further authorization at a cost which shall not exceed \$20,000.00. The foregoing was moved and seconded. It was then moved and seconded to table the issue until 2011. A show of hands was requested by President Drescher; motion failed. The question was moved and members were asked to mark their ballots.

The Bingo Committee presented the association with a check in the amount of \$500.00.

Ken Ludwigsen gave a report regarding the malicious damage and theft encountered during the season.
