The meeting was called to order with 285 members present; number required for a quorum was 285.

The treasurer's report as of November 30, 2010, was as follows: Checking account balance \$35,600; prepaid dues \$18,000; funds in bank reserve account \$103,649; November income \$1,823; November expenses \$11,832; November deficit \$10,009; year-to-date income \$161,440; year-to-date expenses \$128,578; year-to-date net income \$32,862.

>>A report was given regarding the roofing estimates and members were advised that a representative from A & V Roofing and the factory would be making a presentation immediately following the close of the meeting.

>>Members were encouraged to attend the Monday night entertainment scheduled for 2011.

>>Members were invited to attend the children's Christmas program at 9:00 a.m. on December 16.

>>The Dance Committee announced that tickets for the New Year's Eve Dance would go on sale at 9:00 a.m. on Wednesday and Thursday with sales open to the public on Friday.

>>The heat exchanger in the swimming pool has to be replaced and is now obsolete; the plumbing is buried in concrete and needs to be brought up to current code -- it is now a safety hazard;
>>The bricking of the arches on the north side of the building will start on Monday;
>>Mats for the north door of the Clubhouse are still being checked on;
>>The Hidalgo County Health Department has been contacted regarding the javelinas and will try to obtain some more traps; Jack and Jeremiah Martin have obtained the trap from John Gaddis and are currently trapping them;
>>Committee sign up sheets will be posted;
>>The air compressor has been replaced;
>>The Jam Committee would like permission to sell refreshments prior to the Friday night jams between 4:00 and 6:00 p.m.;
>>The kitchen is in need of two 3-quart sauce pans, a grinder pusher and an oven thermometer;
