H-I-G-H-L-I-G-H-T-S OF MINUTES OF GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING

December 8, 2012

Quorum Requirement 281; number present 334; a quorum was present for the conduct of the legal business of the association.

Tom Forbish, Treasurer, gave his report as follows: Cash on hand in the operating account \$56,503.00; reserve account balance \$100,032.00; October income from activities \$ \$779.00 (year-to-date \$157,831.00); October expenses \$7,639.00 (year-to-date \$79,250.00; and October net income/loss - \$6,860.00 (year-to-date \$78,580.00).

A collection for food baskets was handled by Sharon Radl and Vera Ludwigsen.

Bill Anderson, Parliamentarian, read the proposed bylaw amendment changing the quorum requirement from 35% of membership to 250 members. (The results were --- yes and --- no; the motion failed.

Al Schattschneider, Chair of the Nominations Committee, announced the slate of officers running for office. They were Jim Reiland, President, Karol Lippert, Secretary, and Bobbie Bradshaw, Director. The following members were nominated from the floor: Jerry Schneider, Nathan Holland, Lucy Cagler, Joel Erickson and Nona Darholt. Nominations were closed by President Reiland.

Announcements:

>>>Leo Brayman has agreed to chair the Kitchen Committee and will be requesting volunteers;

>>>A tour of the Basilica in San Juan will be on the tour schedule;

>>>The annual chili cook off is scheduled for January 8 and it is hope twelve entries will be received; tickets will be limited to 100 at a cost of \$4.00.

>>>Information on the W.T.A.A. Olympics is posted and encourage members to participate; also, help is needed to set up the hall for Bingo;

>>>The Architectural Committee will meet each Thursday morning at 9:00 a.m.;

>>>The Rio Grande Valley Quilt Show registration will be January 9 at 9:30 a.m. to noon to register for the show scheduled for February 15 and 16;

>>>Members wishing to have audio for their event should contact the Audio Committee in advance;
>>>Members participating in the Angle Tree Project should delivered their gifts to Ceil Shillar by December 17 and also that all members are invited to attend the Flores Elementary School Christmas Program on December 20.
>>>The proper procedure to operate the defibrillator was demonstrated by Bill Eck, Chairman of the Heart Rangers Program;
>>>A collection for food baskets was handled by Sharon Radl and Vera Ludwigsen (the amount of \$654.00 was raised.

Jack Bradshaw, representing the Long-Range Planning Committee displayed the plan for the proposed activity building would be 48' x 60', that the pool hall tables would be moved and there would be two activity rooms for crafts, cards, etc. He advised that three bids had been received and that one covered the turn-key construction of the building, the landscaping and the removal of the wall at the rear of the hall and reconstruction of that space with a folding wall, additional electrical outlets and storage to accommodate activities and provide additional space for membership meetings.

Tom Forbish announced that the projected reserve fund balance will be \$120,000.00 by the end of the year 2012. In addition to that balance the Board of Directors plan to apply for a grant from the National Alliance for Rural Housing to cover 50-80% of the cost of the new activity building. Since the approval of the grant is not known at this time, the Board will seek financing in the form of an unsecured note from individual members which would be in increments of \$5,000.00 each payable in five years at a rate of 3% interest. Based on the last three years' financial data the replayment schedule should be met without an increase in annual dues. Anyone interested in the note program should contact the treasurer.

President Reiland then explained that the total cost of the building would be \$186,000.00 and that a grant from the National Alliance for Rural Housing is being pursued to cover 50-80% of the cost, plus changes to the main hall such as a new air conditioning unit. He further explained that all individual lot owners would be able to apply for a grant to cover energy efficient and energy saving items such as a new roof, windows, appliances, etc. A town hall meeting has been scheduled for January 5 at 3:00 p.m. to have questions regarding the grant answered by the Executive Director of the National Alliance for Rural Housing, the selected contractor and possibly the park attorney.

Results of vote on motion to reduce quorum from 35% to 250 members: 152 yes; 202 no; number required to pass 223. (Bylaw amendments must pass by a two-thirds vote of the quorum present.)

COMMITTEE AND ACTIVITY REPORTS

Activity Coordinator

Please complete the required form for the Activity Coordinator (available at the office) so that your activity and the space required can be confirmed for the coming season. If a new chairperson will be handling the activity, his/her information should be submitted.

All proposed activities MUST be approved by the Activity Director in order to reserve time(s) and space and to ensure that conflicts do not arise. Activities are scheduled on a first-come first-served basis; however, activity chairmen may be consulted in regard to possible rescheduling of proposed activities to better serve the members of the association.

NOTE: Anyone scheduling an event in the Clubhouse should contact a member of the Maintenance Committee in advance of the event so that the air conditioning/heating can be adjusted accordingly. If the audio system is required, complete the applicable section of the Request for Use of the Hall and the Audio Committee will be notified.

Architectural Committee

The Architectural Committee will meet during the winter (October to March) every Thursday morning at 9:00 a.m. During the summer they will meet as requested.

The question most commonly asked is: Who needs to see the committee? Answer: Anyone doing exterior changes to their property. Examples: Awnings (free standing or attached, full lot or small this also includes percolas and gazebos), decks and handicap ramps.

If you now have a patio and wish to enclose it, you will need a permit. Anytime you pour concrete and do framing, YOU NEED A PERMIT. For dimensions, restrictions and other information, start by picking up the questionnaire packet located on the bottom rack of the plastic stack file on the office counter. If you still have questions, contact any member of the architectural committee or come to the meeting on Thursday morning so you can be helped.

The procedures to follow are simple:

- 1) Pick up packet from the office;
- 2) Complete; sign forms in BLUE ink;

- 3) Take all packet contents to Hidalgo County Planning Dept. along with copy of your property DEED and documentation of WATER HOOK UP to obtain permit;
- 4) Submit a copy of the permit to the office or to the Committee;
- 5) NOTIFY Committee when mobile units are scheduled to be set up, when an awning frame is being started and when pouring of concrete is scheduled;
- 6) Notify Committee when the job is complete for final sign off.

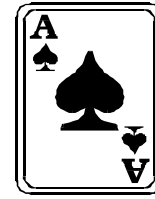
