H-I-G-H-L-I-G-H-T-S OF MINUTES OF GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING

\* \* \* \* \* \* \* \*

February 9, 2012

Quorum required – 276; members present 521; a quorum was present for the conduct of legal business of the association.

Tom Forbish, Treasurer, gave his report as follows: Cash on hand in the operating account \$136,499; reserve fund balance \$130,550.00; year-to-date income \$144,154; year-to-date expenses \$9,914; year-to-date net income/(loss) \$134,240. He also reported that the report of the Audit Committee was posted on the bulletin board.

President Reiland advised that he went to the County Planning Commission with Ismael Martinez, the architect for the clubhouse, and they were advised that H.V.R. DID NOT have to install a sprinkler system and did not need a permit to change the wall between the main hall and the pool room. He further advised that the park attorney had received a letter from Louis Brown, attorney for some of the members of the park. It was ready by Sandi Kienast, Secretary Pro Tem.

Director Bobbie Bradshaw stated that the board recommended that the membership reconsider the action taken at the January 12, 2013, meeting regarding the election of officers/directors and motion regarding the proposed activity building and so moved. Members were asked to mark their ballots and place them in the ballot boxes.

The members were requested to "stand at ease" while the votes were counted.

The Tally Committee reported to President Reiland the following results: Yes votes – 280; No votes – 337; motion failed.

The following announcements were made:

- 1) Linda Kling reported the craft show profit for January, 2013, was \$782.53;
- 2) The Talent-No Talent Show has been scheduled for Tuesday, March 5, at 7:00 p.m. the charge would be canned goods or a donation of cash for the food bank.
- 3) Gerry Sanders and Rita Cepress reported that the Bicycle Club chicken dinner was a big success. Out of the proceeds, the Bike Club donated \$100 towards a second NuStep Machine and \$300 to the association general fund. They also purchased two large skillets, two large coffee pots, two roasters and three heavy cutting boards. Rita also advised that the swiss steak dinner tickets would be available at the office following the meeting.
- 4) Holland America Cruises will be in the parking lot on February 11 at 2:00 p.m. with a bus to show a video tour of Alaska and a tour to the

- Santa Ana National Wildlife Refuge has been scheduled for February 20.
- 5) The 10<sup>th</sup> Annual H.V.R. Golf Tournament is scheduled for March 1 and 2. An information sheet is posted in the pool hall.
- 6) Al Schottschneider, Chair of the Architectural Committee, reminded members that all paperwork MUST be presented to the Architectural Committee PRIOR to going to Hidalgo County for a permit because the County will not issue a permit without their approval.
- Creative Sewing quilts will be on display on March 6. Also, the Dog Lover's group is encouraging pet owners to respect the park rules.
- 8) Bill Eck announced that from May, 2012, to date, four official calls have been answered by the Heart Rangers and in three other instances a Heart Ranger was asked for assistance by a neighbor or friend. From May, 2011, to May, 2012, four official calls were answered. A member requested the telephone number of Elite Ambulance Service it is 956/584-2867.
- 9) The members were asked to observe the park speed limit!
- 10) The new sewer plant should be operational by the end of February.
- 11) Members were told about the walking club and sign-up sheet.
- 12) Someone put bubble bath in the hot tub and it had to be drained and refilled.
- 13) The Board is still dealing with Coca Cola, but to no avail.
- 14) Sandi Kienast announced that she would no longer be editor of the newsletter nor activity coordinator, but would continue to help Karol Lippert in the office, make posters and tickets and do typing for anyone in the park working on park activities or committees. She further advised that the activities that have been meeting for a long time at the same time, place and on the same date did not have to submit any paperwork to the office; their activity will automatically be placed in the activity book. She further advised that the park directory will be printed the week of February 11.

President Reiland asked for nominations from the floor for the office of vice-president. There being none members were directed to mark their ballots and place them in the ballot boxes after adjournment of the meeting.

\*\*\* Office Procedure Changes !! \*\*\*

Effective immediately!! All groups that have held their activity on the same day(s) of the week or the same day of each month (i.e. second Monday), at the same time and at the same place WILL NOT have to submit any paperwork to schedule their activity in the future. These activities will automatically be included on the new seasons' calendar. Of course, if a new chairperson has been named, the office should be contacted immediately by submitting a Request for Use of Recreation Hall or Annex indicating the name and telephone number of the new chairperson.

All proposed **NEW** activities or **SPECIAL EVENTS** MUST be approved by the Activity Coordinator to ensure that conflicts do not arise. All NEW activities will be scheduled on a first-come first-served basis. Certain occasions, such as memorial services for a deceased member, will take precedence and the chairman of the scheduled activity will be contacted that such function has been scheduled.

**NOTE:** The chairman of an event or function scheduled in the Clubhouse should contact a member of the Maintenance Committee in advance of the event so that the air conditioning/heating can be adjusted accordingly. If the audio system is required, complete the applicable section of the Request for Use of the Hall and the Audio Committee will be notified.

#### <<< Architectural Committee >>>

The Architectural Committee will meet during the winter (October to March) every Thursday morning at 9:00 a.m. During the summer they will meet as requested.

The question most commonly asked is: Who needs to consult with the committee? Answer: Anyone doing exterior changes to their property. Examples: Awnings (free standing or attached--all sizes), this also includes percolas and gazebos), decks and handicap ramps.

If you now have a patio and wish to enclose it, you will need a permit. Anytime you pour concrete and do framing, YOU NEED A PERMIT. For dimensions, restrictions and other information, start by picking up the questionnaire packet located on the bottom rack of the plastic stack file on the office counter. If you still have questions, contact any member of the architectural committee or come to the meeting on Thursday morning so you can be helped.

The procedures to follow are simple:

- 1) Pick up packet from the office;
- 2) Complete; sign forms in BLUE ink; <u>TAKE ALL FORMS TO THE H.V.R. ARCHITECTUAL COMMITTEE MEETING FOR APPROVAL.</u> (Meeting day is Thursday at 9:00 a.m.)
- Take all packet contents to Hidalgo County Planning Dept. along with copy of your property DEED and documentation of WATER HOOK UP to obtain permit;
- 4) Submit a copy of the permit to the office or to the Committee;
- 5) NOTIFY Committee when mobile units are scheduled to be set up, when an awning frame is being started and when pouring of concrete is scheduled;
- 6) Notify Committee when the job is complete for final sign off.

### CLOSE UP TIPS FOR MOBILES, PARK MODELS, RVS AND SHEDS

- 1. Cover all furniture and beds with lightweight plastic sheeting.
- 2. Cover toilet bowl and tank with plastic wrap after filling with water, then close lids. Turn water off on stool. (DO NOT put cooking oil in your toilet -- it makes a mess!)
- 3. Fill a large container with water (at least five gallons, if possible) and leave in bathtub and other rooms to provide moisture during the hot summer.
- 4. Put zip lock bags one-half full of water and place over each drain (sinks, tubs, showers and washer drains, etc.) -- keeps the sewer gases and critters out.
- 5. Take batteries out of clocks, smoke alarms and carbon monoxide detectors.
- 6. Put mothballs and possibly Decon under your house.
- 7. Remove hot air furnace registers, wrap with foil and replace.
- 8. Crinkle newspapers and put in refrigerator and freezer along with charcoal; close doors.
- 9. Turn water off going into mobiles, park models, permanent RVs and sheds. Turn off hot water heater at breaker box if you leave the power on. Water heater may be drained.
- 10. Make arrangements to have your property and yard cared for (weed control, plant watering, cutting of lawn, etc.) <u>Complete</u> form to advise association office as to who is responsible for your property during the summer. Consider insect/termite control around the perimeter of your buildings.
- 11. Lock outside electric boxes; put spare key in place where it can be located upon your return or in case of an emergency.
- 12. Ensure that your telephone and electricity providers have summer addresses for billing purposes.
- 13. Consider having telephone service put "on vacation" to ensure getting the same telephone number for next season. For vacation, you must first contact your long distance provider, then SBC. This will also expedite telephone service upon your return. A call to SBC's 800 number in advance will allow telephone service to be in place prior to or at the time of your arrival back in the Valley.
- 14. Secure your property; i.e. security doors and windows and motion detector lights.
- 15. Turn off all propane; storing propane gas grills in your shed with the bottle partially or completely full may be risky. Consider other options.
- 16. Forward mail, if appropriate. Place a note in or on your mailbox, then tape your box closed to prevent a temporary carrier from leaving mail. Cancel your newspaper.
