

December 13, 2013

The meeting was called to order at 9:30 AM by President Jim Reiland. Roll call indicated a quorum was present. Members in attendance: Jim Reiland, Gary Kienast, Tom Forbish, Karol Lippert, Bobbie Bradshaw, Joel Erickson, Nathan Holland and Jim Moore. Rick Radl was absent.

Minutes of the November 15, 2013 meeting were approved.

Reports of Officers:

Tom Forbish – Budget prepared for review. Motion made by Tom Forbish, seconded by Nathan Holland

to accept the 2014 proposed budget. Motion carried

Gary Kienast – Bid for annex carpeting of \$496.58 for a bound 15' x 23'. Bobbie Bradshaw moved to purchase the carpet, seconded by Tom Forbish, motion carried.

<u>Old Business</u>: Ken Sutter -- The gas shut-off valve has not yet been installed in the kitchen

Bill Baker, owner of Baker Launderama, addressed the Board regarding our laundry machine maintenance. Bobbie Bradshaw moved to have Mr. Baker contract the service and maintenance on the equipment and we will be responsible for the utilities, seconded by Nathan Holland. Motion carried.

Bobbie Bradshaw moved that we disapprove the request for the women's birthday money, seconded by Jim Moore, motion carried.

New Business:

Ken Sutter – A bid was obtained for the proposed 8'8" x 38' brick storage building in the amount of \$11,105. Ken will present the information at the December Membership Meeting and it will be placed on the ballot for the Annual Membership Meeting.

Committee Reports:

Quilt Committee – Karen Eck wishes to present to the membership two quilts at the Membership Meeting that will be raffled.

NuStep Committee – Bill Anderson announced that the Jack of Spades jackpot is \$2800. A NuStep flyer promotes a \$200 discount off the price of a new machine. The price of a new machine is \$3795.00 with \$275.00 shipping. The committee has approximately \$1800.00 at this time to apply to purchase of a possible new machine. There is possibly consideration of replacing old exercise machines instead of the NuStep. No action was taken at this time.

The following issues were addressed/discussed:

Nona Dorholt presented information regarding garbage bins as an alternative to our garbage bags. More information is needed on this issue. A Winter Festival was discussed with a possible February date.

John Crawford asked about the proper presentation of lots for sale and rent. A committee is to be sought for this project.

The meeting was recessed at 10:40 am for an executive session.

Meeting reconvened at 11:40 am.

Meeting adjourned at 11:40 am.

<<< Activity Coordinator >>>

All groups that have held their activity on the same day(s) of the week or the same day of each month (i.e. second Monday), at the same time and at the same place, WILL NOT have to submit any paperwork to schedule their activity in the future. These activities will automatically be included on the new season's calendar. Of course, if a new chairperson has been named, the office should be contacted immediately by submitted a Request for Use of the Hall and/or Annex indicating the name and telephone number of the new chairperson.

All proposed NEW activities or special events MUST be approved by the Activity Coordinator to ensure that conflicts do not arise. All NEW activities will be scheduled on a first come-first served basis.

NOTE: The chairman of an event or function scheduled in the Hall <u>is responsible</u> for contacting a member of the Maintenance Committee *in advance of the event* so that the air conditioning/heating can be adjusted accordingly. If the audio system is required, complete the applicable section of the Request for Use of Hall.

<<< Architectural Committee >>>

The Architectural Committee will meet during the winter (October to March) every Thursday morning at 9:00 a.m. During the summer they meet as requested.

The question most commonly asked is: Who needs to consult with the committee? Answer: Anyone doing exterior changes to their property. Examples: Awning (free-standing or attached – all sizes, which includes percolas and gazebos), decks and handicap ramps.

If you now have a patio and wish to enclose it, you will need a permit. Anytime you pour concrete and do framing, YOU NEED A PERMIT. For dimensions,

restrictions and other information, start by picking up the questionnaire packet located in the bottom rack of the plastic stack on the office counter. If you still have questions, contact any member of the Architectural Committee or come to the meeting on Thursday morning so you can be helped.

The procedures to follow are simple:

- 1) Pick up packet from the office;
- Complete; sign forms in BLUE ink only; TAKE ALL FORMS TO THE H.V.R. ARCHI-TECTURAL COMMITTEE MEETING FOR APPROVAL. (Meeting day is Thursday at 9:00 a.m.);
- Take packet contents to Hidalgo County Planning Dept. along with a copy of your property DEED and documentation of WATER HOOK UP to obtain permit;
- Submit a copy of the permit to the office or to the Committee;
- NOTIFY the Committee when mobile units are scheduled to be set up, when an awning frame is being started and when pouring of concrete is scheduled;
- 6) Notify the Committee when the job is
- 7) completed for a final sign off.

JACK OF SPADES 50/50 RAFFLE A Winner Every Week STARTED MONDAY, NOVEMBER 11 !!!

The cards from a regular deck of cards (minus jokers and deuces) will be placed in individual sealed envelopes. They will then be shuffled so no one knows which card is in which envelope. These envelopes are then locked in a case which will remain in the H.V.R. office.

The committee will sell raffle tickets at a cost of \$1.00 each which will be placed in the weekly drawing that will take place during the Wednesday evening Bingo game during intermission. Participants do not need to be present to win.

The raffle ticket that is drawn will tell us the weekly winner who will then choose an envelope. If that envelope contains the Jack of Spades the person wins 50% of the money and the committee keeps 50%. If the envelope does not contain the Jack of Spades, the money rolls over to the next week; all raffle tickets are thrown away; new tickets are then sold for the next week's drawing.

If the winner is not present at the time of drawing, an independent person will draw an envelope on behalf of the winner.

The raffle will continue for 18 weeks even if the Jack of Spades is found – if there is a winner before the end of 18 weeks, a new raffle may be started with a new set of cards and continue until the end of 18 weeks.

If the Jack of Spades is not drawn, then each week the winner has a chance to win \$30.00 per face card or \$20.00 per numbered card.

Tickets will be sold at the Clubhouse each Monday and Friday from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon.

The weekly drawing will be held at the Wednesday evening Bingo game during intermission. Participants <u>do not</u> need to be present to win.






Creative Quilting
