HIDDEN VALLEY RANCH PROPERTY OWNERS ASSOCI-ATION January 10, 2014

The meeting was called to order at 9:30 AM by President Jim Reiland. Roll call indicated a quorum was present. Members in attendance: Jim Reiland, Gary Kienast, Tom Forbish, Karol Lippert, Bobbie Bradshaw, Joel Erickson, Nathan Holland and Jim Moore. Rick Radl was absent.

Minutes of the December 13, 2013 meeting were approved.

#### Reports of Officers:

Tom Forbish – we need to identify the surplus for a building project for tax purposes so that we are not just accumulating money. Bobbie Bradshaw moved that we designate building fund account, seconded by Joel Erickson, carried.

Gary Kienast – Talked to Barry Lewis regarding the grants. The Appropriations Committee will be meeting on January 15<sup>th</sup> to see if they will be allocating monies.

The cloggers would like to be able to roll out linoleum on which to clog. One major problem would be storage of the linoleum. Suggestion from floor was to use duct tape on their shoes. Gary will contact them with the suggestion of using duct tape

Karol Lippert – The Winter Festival jointly sponsored by HVR & LVR will be held on February 16 at 3:00 PM in HVR's parking lot.

#### Reports of Directors:

Jim Moore reported that the clubhouse is not being left in an appropriately clean manner after events. Jim moved to change the board meeting time back to 9:00 AM, seconded by Joel Erickson, carried.

Bobbie Bradshaw – The kitchen committee has reported that the kitchen is not being cleaned properly after the Jam. Tom Forbish will contact the chairman

#### **New Business:**

Pet area – Jack Martin will not participate. It is the consensus of the board that we do nothing. Jim Moore moved that the board go on record as opposing any king of dog walking facility within the boundaries of HVR, seconded by Gary Kienast, carried.

Joe Roberts has asked for 5 card tables to be replaced. Tom Forbish moved to authorize Joe to purchase the card tables, seconded by Gary Kienast, carried.

Louie Cagler asked if we could ask the general membership if they would like the long range planning committee to draw a plan to landscape the land south of the shuffleboard at Saturday's park meeting; also ask if they would like to have and update the kitchen with a new stove, refrigerator and freezer. Bobbie Bradshaw moved that we don't do anything with that lot until we know what the grant situation is going to be, seconded by Jim Moore, carried.

The new refrigerator, freezer and stove is a maintenance project. If grant comes through we would get reimbursed. Tom Forbish moved to pursue replacing the stove. Ron Kling was asked to obtain the information for a new stove, refrigerator and freezer, if possible, in time for the park meeting. Motion mod-

ified to include the freezer and refrigerator, seconded by Jim Moore, carried.

Committee Reports:

Rules Committee – Bill Anderson reported that we need to have a rules enforcement committee. Dick Harris is the new chairman for the Rules Committee. Portions of the changes in the law will be read at the meeting tomorrow.

The following issues were addressed/discussed:

Karen Eck has requested that a banner be hung in the office area advising people to go to the HVR website to get information on the park. Gary Kienast will investigate further.

Judy Fink reported the cleaning crew is not cleaning the clubhouse garbage can. Harold Cowan will be contacted to report the need to be cleaned.

John Mackey asked that we consider a bocce ball court to replace the pentague court. This issue will be addressed at the park meeting seeking a show of hands for an interest in a bocce ball court.

Meeting adjourned at 10:40 am.

#### TREASURER'S REPORT:

In 2013 HVR reserve account balance was increased \$45,000; the board has designated the balance of \$175,388 as a Building Reserve Account.

Financial Statements are posted on the bulletin board and subject to audit.

Dance Committee – Ken Sutter announced that The Renaissance Rockers are playing tonight and that Jealous Heart will be playing for the dance on January 18<sup>th</sup>.

Heart Rangers – Bill Eck reported that there have not been any calls in the past month.

Architect Committee – Al Schattschneider reported that the committee is meeting every Thursday morning. Call with any questions. No job is complete until reported finished.

Law Changes

The following is a synopsis of the pending bylaw changes to be made by the Hidden Valley Ranch Property Owners Association (HVRPOA) Rules Committee. Changes are indicated by <u>underline</u> or in parentheses (). The reason for the change is shown in *italics*. CH 209 and sections thereof refer to Texas Property Code Title 11 Restrictive Covenants Chapter 209 Texas Residential Property Owners Protection Act, which contains statutes governing residential subdivision's property owners associations. Voting Rights Act of 1965 refers to that act as amended by various Public Laws and enacted by Several Congresses!

Article I Members. Anyone who purchases real property in Hidden Valley Ranch subdivision is a member of the association. (*Removed superfluous wording*)

Article II Members in Good Standing. A member is in good standing if they have not been found in violation of any covenant, stipulation, or restriction of HVR subdivision by the board of directors and/or a court of law. (Ch 209, Sections 209.0059 and 209.0064.)

Article IV, Section 2 Monthly Meetings. Regular general membership meetings will be held monthly on the second Saturday of each month at 9:00 a.m. beginning in November and continuing through December, January, February and March at the recreation hall without further notice than these bylaws. (Removed superfluous wording)

Article IV, Section 5 Quorum. Thirty-five percent (35%) of the members of the association must be present in person, or by properly executed absentee ballot, at all meetings to constitute a quorum to legally transact the business of the association. If no quorum is present, the only business that can be transacted is (a) taking of a measure to obtain a quorum; (b) fixing the time at which to adjourn; and (c) to adjourn or to take a recess. (Ch 209, Sections 209.0058, 209.592.00593)

Article IV, Section 6 Voting Provisions.

Recorded owners may cast only one (1) ballot per assessed lot. Individual ballots must be signed by each member voting before said ballot is deposited in the ballot box provided. Proxy holders, must sign the ballot indicating the proxy holder's printed name and the name of the proxy assignor. Unsigned ballots shall be considered null and void and shall be shown in the final report of the Tally Committee as invalid. (Ch 209, Section 209.0058, the Voting Rights Act of 1965, Amended, and Public Law 109–246 109th Congress)

- a. Members unable to attend a meeting may cast their vote by absentee ballot, obtainable from the HVRPOA Secretary, completed, and returned in person, by regular U. S. mail or fax by close of business on the day prior to the meeting. (Changed to accommodate the varying posted hours of the business office of the association.)
- b. Members unable to attend a meeting may appoint any other member of the association in good standing as their proxy to vote in their stead. Appropriate proxy forms must be requested from the business office, completed and submitted to the duly elected Secretary of the association by regular mail or by fax by close of business on the day prior to the meeting. A member in good standing may hold only one (1) proxy. (Changed to accommodate the varying posted hours of the business office; CH 209, Section 209.0058 and Voting Rights Act of 1965, Amended and Public Law 109-246 109th Congress)

Article V Meetings,

Section 3 Place of Meeting. Defines the place. (Removed superfluous wording).

Section 4 Meetings

a. Regular <u>open</u> meetings of the officers/directors shall be held each month beginning in November and continuing through March, prior to the general membership meeting without further notice than these bylaws. Notice of all open board of directors meetings shall be posted at least seven (7) days prior to said meeting and shall be emailed to all members who have supplied their email address to the association webmaster. (CH 209, Section 209.0051 (2013))

#### Section 7 Vacancies.

- A. Any vacancy occurring on the board of directors, except for the office of president, which is covered in Article VI, Section 2, here, shall be filled by an affirmative vote of a majority of the remaining officers/directors at a regular or special meeting, or by a telephone conference call with no less than a quorum of officers/directors present. The member selected to fill the vacancy shall serve for the unexpired term of his/her predecessor (CH)in office. 209. Section 209.00593-2013)
- B. In lieu of A. above, the board of directors may choose to post notice of a vacancy on the board of directors in the recreation hall to advise the membership that any member in good standing may notify the board of directors of his/her wish to be considered for the position. Ten (10) days following the posting of the notice, the board of directors shall select the member who will fill the vacancy and said member shall serve for the unexpired term of his/her predecessor.

D.  $\underline{A}$  article VIII Assessments Section 3 Termination of Membership. This section is removed in its entirety. CH

209, Section 209.0064)

#### Article X Miscellaneous

Section 6. Termination of Membership. Membership in the corporation may be terminated upon commission of any felony against the corporation. Such felony may be determined by law enforcement investigation alone, by subsequent conviction in criminal court, or by admission on the part of the member.

Special Rules of Order

#### SECTION A

#### **Board of Directors Meetings**

Par.2 The Board of Directors shall open meetings to the general membership subject to the limited right of the board of directors to meet in executive session. (CH 209, Section 209.0051)

#### SECTION B General Membership Meetings

Par 2. All association members shall be required to sign in at the appropriate credentials desk at all membership meetings. All membership requirements including (strike the reference to payment of dues and assessments) completion of appropriate office documentation to determine qualifications to attend association meetings, shall be completed by (strike 3:00 p.m.) close of business on the day prior to ... (CH 209, Section 209.0059 and to accommodate the varying posted business office hours)

Par. 9 Voting on all motions shall be done by signed paper ballots... (CH 209, Section 209.0058)

# NOTICE TO MEMBERS OF HIDDEN VALLEY RANCH PROPERTY OWNERS' ASSOCIATION

In accordance with ARTICLE XI, AMENDMENTS, Section 1. Power of Members to Amend Bylaws, you are hereby notified that the following Bylaw amendments will be presented for approval at the February 8, 2014, meeting of Hidden Valley Ranch Property Owners' Association.

#### **CURRENT BYLAW:**

ARTICLE IV. MEETING OF MEMBERS. Section 6.

c. Members unable to attend regularly scheduled or special meetings may appoint any other member of the association in good standing as their proxy to vote in their stead. Appropriate proxy forms must be requested from the business office of the association and after completion thereof submitted to the duly elected Secretary in person, by regular mail or by fax. The Secretary shall be responsible for notifying the member named in said proxy that he/she has been so appointed. Proxy forms may cover one or more meetings. A member of the association in good standing may hold no more than four (4) proxies. Added January 2005.

CHANGE: Change the number of proxies from four to one.

# PROPOSED BYLAW (Change Underlined): ARTICLE IV. MEETING OF MEMBERS. Section 6

c. . . . . . A member of the association in good standing may hold <u>only one (1) proxy</u>. Added January 2005 and Amended February 2014.

**REASON:** To coincide with the new voting rules and procedures and to eliminate the solicitation of proxies.

#### **CURRENT BYLAW:**

**ARTICLE XI. AMENDMENTS** 

**SECTION 1.** Power of Members to Amend Bylaws. The bylaws of the corporation may be amended, repealed, or added to, or new bylaws may be adopted by two-thirds (2/3rds) of a quorum of the members at any regularly scheduled or special meeting of the association where a quorum is present, provided the proposed amendments are submitted in writing at a previous special or regu-

lar meeting of the members or the officers/directors. A copy of the approved amendment(s) shall be available to each member within thirty (30) days of approval. *Amended January 2005*.

CHANGE: Change the above to (a) and add the following paragraph: The Rules Committee shall be authorized, without approval of the general membership, to amend these Bylaws to conform to any and all Texas State Legislature changes or amendments to the Texas Residential Property Owners Protection Act, Chapter 209. The Rules Committee shall advise the membership of any changes immediately upon notice. All other proposed amendments shall be handled in accordance with the rules set in Section 1 (a) above.

## PROPOSED BYLAW (Changes Underlined): ARTICLE XI. AMENDMENTS

**SECTION 1.** Power of Members to Amend Bylaws.

- (a) Wording exactly the same as set out above, paragraph numbered (a).
- (b) The Rules Committee shall be authorized, without approval of the general membership, to amend these Bylaws to conform to any and all Texas State Legislature changes or amendments to the Texas Residential Property Owners Protection Act, Chapter 209. The Rules Committee shall advise the membership of any changes immediately upon notice. All other proposed amendments shall be handled in accordance with the rules set in Section 1 (a) above.

Amended January 2005 and February 2014.

**REASON FOR CHANGE:** To allow the Rules Committee to maintain and update the Bylaws according to all state statutes in a current and efficient manner.

#### **IMPORTANT NOTICE!!**

## CREDENTIALS CHECK IN PROCEDURES

Effectively immediately, members must check in at all general membership and special meetings according to <u>lot number</u>, not <u>alphabetically</u>. Table #1 will check in Lots 1 through 125; Table #2 will check in Lots 126 through 150; Table #3 will check in Lots 151 through 375; and Table #4 will check in Lots 375 through 520. Your patience and cooperation are requested to assist in a smooth transition to the new check in procedures.

Those members owning more than one lot must check in according to the lot with the lowest number; i.e., a member owning Lot #28 plus Lot #394 should check in at Table #1. It will NOT be necessary to go to more than one check in table as all ballots will be disbursed at the original check in table. Members holding proxies will still be required to check in for the person signing the proxy. The lot number(s) appear on the proxy form.

An alphabetical member list will be posted on the front door. Also, the sergeants-at-arms stationed at the front door will have an alphabetical member list and will be happy to assist anyone who does not remember their lot number.

Note: All H.V.R. members may attend membership meetings; however, lots that are NOT required to pay the annual assessment are NOT entitled to vote. These lots include <u>undeveloped lots</u> (no water meter) and <u>restricted lots</u> (contiguous double lots and one and one-half lots that pay only one assessment).

#### <<< Activity Coordinator >>>

All groups that have held their activity on the same day(s) of the week or the same day of each month (i.e. second Monday), at the same time and at the same place, WILL NOT have to submit any paperwork to schedule their activity in the future. These activities will automatically be included on the new season's calendar. Of course, if a new chairperson has been named,

the office should be contacted immediately by submitted a Request for Use of the Hall and/or Annex indicating the name and telephone number of the new chairperson.

All proposed NEW activities or special events MUST be approved by the Activity Coordinator to ensure that conflicts do not arise. All NEW activities will be scheduled on a first come-first served basis.

NOTE: The chairman of an event or function scheduled in the Hall <u>is responsible</u> for contacting a member of the Maintenance Committee *in advance* of the event so that the air conditioning/heating can be adjusted accordingly. The Architectural Committee will meet during the winter (October to March) every Thursday morning at 9:00 a.m. During the summer they meet as requested.

The question most commonly asked is: Who needs to consult with the committee? Answer: Anyone doing exterior changes to their property. Examples: Awning (free-standing or attached – all sizes, which includes percolas and gazebos), decks and handicap ramps.

If you now have a patio and wish to enclose it, you will need a permit. Anytime you pour concrete and do framing, YOU NEED A PERMIT. For dimensions, restrictions and other information, start by picking up the questionnaire packet located in the bottom rack of the plastic stack on the office counter. If you still have questions, contact any member of the Architectural Committee or come to the meeting on Thursday morning so you can be helped.

The procedures to follow are simple:

- 1) Pick up packet from the office;
- Complete; sign forms in BLUE ink only; TAKE ALL FORMS TO THE H.V.R. ARCHI-TECTURAL COMMITTEE MEETING FOR AP-PROVAL. (Meeting day is Thursday at 9:00 a.m.);
- Take packet contents to Hidalgo County Planning Dept. along with a copy of your property DEED and documentation of WA-TER HOOK UP to obtain permit;
- Submit a copy of the permit to the office or to the Committee;
- NOTIFY the Committee when mobile units are scheduled to be set up, when an awning frame is being started and when pouring of concrete is scheduled;
- 6) Notify the Committee when the job is
- 7) Completed for a final sign off.
