# PROCEDURE TO BRING A MATTER BEFORE THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OR GENERAL ASSEMBLY

In accordance with Special Rule of Order Section A, Board of Director Meetings, any member of the association wishing to bring an issue before the Board of Directors MUST present the request to the association president at least three (3) days prior to the meeting and Section B, General Membership Meetings, any member of the association wishing to bring an issue before the Board of Directors MUST present the request to the association president at least five (5) days prior to the meeting. Reason: To allow time to obtain all necessary information regarding the matter prior to discussion thereon.
