H-I-G-H-L-I-G-H-T-S OF MINUTES OF BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

November 11, 2011

The meeting was called to order at 9:03 AM by President Jim Reiland. Roll call indicated a quorum was present. Members in attendance: Jim Reiland, Larry Woodard, Tom Forbish, Karol Lippert, Lucy Cagler, Joe Roberts and Mike Yost. Bobbie Bradshaw and Nathan Holland were absent.

Minutes of the April 7, 2011 and October 14, 2011 meetings were approved.

Reports of Officers:

Tom Forbish presented an updated budget which included mileage reimbursement. He suggested that due to the high gasoline prices we reimburse mileage at 20 cents a mile to cover gas for authorized directors and committee chairmen and any other authorized members who acquire supplies for the park. Mike Yost suggested a computer program be used in any dispute. Tom moved to approve the budget and post it, seconded by Mike Yost, motion carried.

** Tom moved to retain the \$300 assessment for 2012, seconded by Lucy Cagler, motion carried.

** Tom reported he has learned that First Choice has been charging sales tax on our electric usage. He has recovered \$2900.00 since February 2009.

Reports of Directors:

Larry Woodard – reported as liaison for the swimming pool, issues with cleaning of the pool deck.

Lucy Cagler – reports she has talked with Mrs. Perez at Wagon Trails Landscaping about removing the old cactus behind the clubhouse. She will remove the cactus and dispose of it for \$60 and will plant any new plantings for the

same fee. Lucy moved that we hire Mrs. Perez to do the work, seconded by Joe Roberts, motion carried.

Lucy reported as Maintenance liaison Ken and Ruth Sutter scrubbed the hall tiles.

** Problems with people changing the thermostat settings. Lucy moved that the thermostats be set at 75 degrees for the hall and 72 degrees for events, seconded by Larry Woodard, motion carried.

** Ken Sutter is stenciling equipment for HVR identity and numbering them.

** The water fountain isn't cooling the water and if it is not able to be repaired a new one should be purchased to replace it.

** Mike and Carol Patchak have agreed to manage the coffee and donuts during the park meetings.

Joe Roberts – reported on the recycling project. Even though it has not yet been delivered, we will proceed with acquiring it and will monitor its use and the upkeep. If not acceptable it will then be removed.

Committee Reports:

Architectural Committee – Jim Moore reported that he has contacted the assessor's office and a shed was defined.

Unfinished Business:

President Reiland revisited the Nu Step exercise machine. The company is willing to honor the previous special of a 30-day trial with free shipping if we return the machine. Mike Yost moved that we accept the Nu Step on a trial basis if the delivery is on or after December 10 so that the members have an opportunity to give it a trial and vote on it at the January park meeting, motion carried.

New Business:

Janet Hinds sought approval for the erection of the Christmas Angel Tree and a collection to be taken at the December park meeting for the project. Mike Yost moved to do so, seconded by Lucy Cagler, motion carried.

Meeting adjourned at 10:08 AM.
