COMMITTEE CHAIRMEN REPORTS:

Nomination Committee – Al Schattschneider introduced his committee – Ray Fink and Clarence Wolff. The candidates were then announced: for Vice President – Larry Woodard and Don Leonard; for Treasurer – Tom Forbish; for Directors – Bobbie Bradshaw, Rick Radl and Jim Moore. Nominations for Directors were sought from the floor. Roy Hamilton was nominated but declined the nomination. There were no further nominations for Director.

Nominations were sought three times from the floor for Vice President and for Treasurer but none were forthcoming. Nominations were then closed for all open positions. The candidates will be presented at the Meet the Candidates.

Heart Rangers – John Crawford stated there has been only eight medical emergencies this year. He announced a new supply of Files of Life is now available. He also introduced the LifeAid medical alert system.

Dance – Rio Southern on December 17th Linda Kling reminded everyone about the Craft Show for December 17th.

Judy Lungo, Bingo co-chair, presented the HVR Board with \$533.

Charlene Horner, Highlights editor, announced December 26 deadline for the January newsletter articles.

Entertainment Committee – Patty Peterson announced that Linda Hisaw is the new committee chair and that the entertainment season begins in January with an exciting schedule. Webmaster – Ray Fink noted there are new features on the website

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

Long Range Planning Committee – Ron Kling recognized his committee – Kay Smith, Carol Rait, Lew Fry and Jack Bradshaw. He then presented the committee's recommendation for the development of the land on the north side of the clubhouse. In March 2010 funds up to \$20,000 were approved by the membership to proceed with the development. Before proceeding the county required a complete survey of the association's property. The plan presented is for 22 new parking places, a retention pond necessitated by the county, and appropriate landscaping. Consequently, an additional \$6,000 is needed to complete the parking lot. The landscaping bid is \$22,200.

Tom Forbish explained there is sufficient money to complete these projects without going into the 2012 budget. This will be a capital improvement which will increase the value of the property and, hence, each member's property value. President Reiland gave instructions to mark the ballots.

Ron Kling moved to complete the project with the landscaping, the motion was seconded and ballots were marked.

ANNOUNCEMENTS:

Janet Hinds conducted a collection for food baskets which will be delivered on Wednesday. All the names were taken from the Christmas tree. The Flores School children will present their program on Thursday.

Peggy Beckman announced a new project – Pennies in a jar along with the doll house for the "Women Together" Abuse Center. Six car loads of goods have been donated from this park since the first of November.

Judy Lungo announced the doll house will be raffled on February 14^{th} .

H-I-G-H-L-I-G-H-T-S OF MINUTES OF **BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING**

December 09, 2011

The meeting was called to order at 9:01 AM by President Jim Reiland. Roll call indicated a quorum was present. Members in attendance: Jim Reiland, Tom Forbish, Karol Lippert, Bobbie Bradshaw, Lucy Cagler, Nathan Holland, Joe Roberts and Mike Yost. Larry Woodard was absent.

Minutes of the November 11, 2011 meeting were approved.

Reports of Officers:

Tom Forbish moved that \$1,000 be used as a guideline for capitalizing puchases, seconded by Lucy Cagler, motion carried.

Tom has been studying our electric costs:

- **. The flood lights on the boulevard palms are ineffective due to the tree heighth. Clear LED string lights were suggested as an alternative. This idea will be investigated.
- ** The electric cost of the 8 floodlights on the north property line is being investigated. Joe Roberts and Nathan Holland will be contacting the affected members.
- ** Electric rates are being investigated for the new vear.

Reports of Directors:

Lucy Cagler – Maintenance liaison reported that Ron Kling is ordering the water fountain.

- ** All outside lights have been replaced.
- ** Roger Hinds and Louie Cagler are investigating the purchase of a soft serve ice cream machine.

Bobbie Bradshaw – Heart Ranger liaison reported that John Crawford will be presenting to the membership a medical alert necklace or bracelet.

Committee Reports:

Bylaw Committee – Bill Anderson addressed the questions of a memo received from Judy Hamilton concerning a quorum. He stated that unless it is in the Bylaws no business can be conducted if a quorum is

lost during a meeting He said the Bylaw Committee will be meeting on this issue and concerning changing the quorum number. The secretary was asked to provide the numbers of attendance at the meetings in the past two years.

** A workshop for the purpose of discussing this issue was set for Tuesday, December 13th at 8:30 am. Long Range Planning Committee – Ron Kling presented plans and bids for the development of the land north of the clubhouse, including landscaping. The concrete bid was \$26,500 and the landscaping bid was for \$18,850. Lucy Cagler moved that we use concrete instead of asphalt, seconded by Bobbie Bradshaw, motion carried. Lucy moved that we accept the concrete bid of Peralez Concrete Works, Mike Yost seconded, motion carried. Lucy moved that we present the whole project to the membership tomorrow, Nathan Holland seconded, motion carried.

Maintenance Committee – Ron Kling reported there are still three cameras to mount. He has found the exact same cable needed to complete the installation of all eight cameras. The kitchen sink faucet has been purchased and will be installed.

Audio Committee - Bob Moor explained the audio committee wants to move the audio cabinet to the back of the room along the wall. The church has agreed to fund half of the cable costs which are \$540 plus tax. Mike Yost moved that we approve the purchase and the cabinet move, seconded by Joe Roberts, motion carried. The meeting was suspended at 10:30 AM to go into Executive Session.

Executive Session convened at 10:40 AM.

Meeting adjourned at 11:17 am.
