Hidden Valley has been lucky so far. The last 20 years we have been able to make our park one of the best in the valley. This has kept our property values up. Until the last few years, we have had several people run for positions on the board of directors. Right now the people who have kept this park running are old and tired or have passed away. The new people say "We came down here to play, not to work." Well, we also came down here to play, but, if we had not volunteered to keep this park at the level it is, then you would not have this park to come to. If you wanted people to wait on you, then you should have gone to a resort, not an association.

Examples:

<u>Heart Rangers</u>; Once done by volunteers, now, gone completely.

<u>Pool Maintenance</u>; Once done by volunteers, now we pay \$70.00 per week or \$3,640.00 per year.

<u>Ground Maintenance</u>; Once done by volunteers, now we pay \$150.00 per month or \$1,800.00 per year.
