#### **CAN COLLECTION BEING CANNED**

For many years, the Park has had a "can chute" on the side of the shed building, into which residents could drop their aluminum beverage cans.

Even when the Recycle Program operated by G & B Childress was started, any cans brought to them would have their tabs first removed for the Shriners Hospital Collection before they also placed the cans in this chute.

The Board has decided that, effective March 1st, the can chute will be sealed off and the Park will no longer maintain this service. Among other reasons, it created more "sticky" problems in the shed than it was worth.

Cans will still be accepted by the Childress recycling efforts Thursdays 8-9:30 am

#### **HVR PARK COVID RESTRICTIONS**

The HVR Board is still closely watching and adhering to all Hidalgo County orders pertaining to public safety regarding COVID. As orders from them change, so then will HVR's.

Residents are urged to frequently check with the office or through the HVR website messages for the latest protocol updates.

#### **GATE REMOTES**

Effective April 1st, the "card slot" for the Park's canal entrance gate will no longer be useable.

The high maintenance repair costs caused from make-shift "cards" repeatedly jamming the mechanisms was one of the underlying reasons.

HVR residents needing "after hours" passage through the gate will require a remote. A new supplier has been found for these and, while the old remotes will still work, the new ones are less expensive. They are now only \$15 each, and will be programmed and ready to go upon purchase. We highly recommend if you do not have one yet that you get one.

Renters can also purchase the \$15 remotes and, at the end of their stay, these will be bought back for \$10 and these used remotes will be available for purchase by residents for the \$10.

<u>PS</u>: If you ever need to get out of the Park in the middle of the night for a medical emergency or early flight, and you don't have the means to open the gate, you can **drive over to Leisure's gate**. It automatically opens for any vehicle that slowly approaches it.

(Note: You can get out that way, but not back in.)

# **SUMMERTIME YARD CARE**

Residents are reminded that **all lots** should be repeatedly cleaned of palm tree fronds and citrus fruit rotting on the ground. This deters bugs (ants and other creepy-crawlies) as well as rodents (mice and rats), which in turn attract snakes.

As well, weeds must be kept under control. It is surprising how quickly the summertime weeds will pop up and thrive through the gravel rocks, despite the summer heat.

Please **make arrangements** with someone to check on and maintain your Summer yard cleanup and weed control spraying as often as necessary.

Complete the office form naming your "yard care" person. Without a contact name, you run the risk of forcing the Park to have to hire someone and send you the bill.

There are some yard-care service providers within the Park. Ask around for names. Be sure to collaborate with any provider regarding what your expectations are versus their actual services.

# **UPDATE YOUR PROPERTY ADS**

Postings of "For Sale" or "For Rent" ads for HVR Properties must be re-dated or re-written at least every 12 months or risk being removed from the hallway bulletin board. If you or someone you know has an older ad that is still valid, please redate the ad or make a new one.

Due to bulletin board space, those **ads must be no larger than 5.5" x 8"** (1/2 sheet of paper).

Posting larger ads or bending the rules by posting two half-page ads for the same location (such as one of photos and one of info) is unfair to other advertisers seeking a spot, and may result in having your ad completely removed.

Let's be fair to all advertisers.

The Architectural Committee usually meets every Thursday 10 am near the main office, but with the Covid restrictions may be opting to meet on a "necessity" basis only.

Information on who to contact for Architectual Committee approvals **over the Summer months** will be posted near the Office bulletin board.

Volunteers are needed for this Architectural Committee and for someone to chair it.

# **GOLF COURSE FOR SALE**?

Frustrated by years of financial shortfalls, the La Joya School Board is looking for options to either increase revenue or sell the Howling Trails Golf Course adjacent to HVR, LVR, and GVR.

"It was pretty much a bad investment," said trustee Alex Cantu.

La Joya ISD purchased the golf course and its 215 acres in 2014 for \$4.9 million with restrictions, including that the property remain a golf course for at least 25 years.

Trustee Espie Ochoa said the school board had discussed the golf course losses and a possible sale, if they could buy a potential buyer willing to comply with the deed restrictions and provide access to La Joya ISD students.

The Board received unwelcome attention in 2019 when a State senator introduced a bill to prohibit school districts from owning golf courses and water parks. The bill stalled in the Senate.

# **LADIES GOLFING TIP # 387:**

Or, "To Bra or not to Bra? That is the guestion!"

One morning in October 1999, the bodies of two women were found underneath a tree on a golf course near London, England. For more than 15 hours, golfers had assumed they were homeless and sleeping under the tree. When they were eventually determined to be dead, responders projected that a thunder storm the night before provided the first clue as to what might have killed them, and autopsies later confirmed it. The women were sheltering under the tree when it was struck by lightning, killing them instantly.

Investigators believed the women might have survived the strike, had one of them not been wearing an underwire bra. Burn patterns on her chest and a melted wire in her bra indicated that the lightning bolt had jumped from the tree to her bra, instantly killing both her and her nearby friend.

But before you or your partner toss out your underwire bras to go golfing, consider this: in September 2015 a woman struck by lightning in China may have been <u>saved</u> by her underwire bra. In that case, investigators concluded the wires diverted the electricity around her vital organs, thus sparing her life.

# **SOME FRIENDLY REMINDERS:**

- There is no such thing as a "rolling stop".
   Come to a FULL STOP at posted Park stop signs. This includes golf carts and bicycles.
- Cover the hot tub when done, no matter what time of day. Reduce heat loss / costs.
- Turn off the fans and lights, if you're the last one out the door of any HVR building. (Exceptions: lights in bathroom hallway and over the front desk of clubhouse.)
- SLOW DOWN, please. We still have too many vehicles speeding in the Park.
- Volunteers are needed for big and small jobs over the Summer. If you're a full-time resident, consider stepping in to help.
- There's still a lot of citrus fruit lying on the ground. It needs to be picked up often.
   Don't entice rodents, or allow potential new HVR buyers to see an unkempt Park.
- Park residents in temporary need of crutches, a cane, a rolling walker, potty chair, or wheelchair may borrow them free from the Office.
- Walk on the left side of the roads FACING traffic. Use flashlights and wear lightcolored or reflective clothing in the evening. See and be seen!
- Pick up after your pets. Non-Service Pets are not allowed in any HVR building.
- Consider walking the dog of a less-mobile neighbor a few times a week (if not daily).
   All three of you will benefit from this.
- If you use any Park facilities, clean it up/ straighten it up when through. Leave it looking better than when you walked in.

#### BEFORE YOU HEAD BACK "UP NORTH"...

... here's a "to-do" checklist before leaving: Sink & shower drains sealed off with a sturdy baggie full of water as a "plug" and saran wrap over the **toilet bowl** to prevent evaporation. Buckets of water placed throughout the rooms, to provide humidity. Termites do exist in this area! Rat/mice pellets & traps and moth balls placed under your skirting and on top of RV tires to deter varmints getting in. That's cheaper than replacing gnawed wires and hoses! Arrangements made with someone to spray your yard for weeds, and water your plants/trees. Hot water heater switch flipped off. Why heat water when you're not there? Turn off the water supply at the curb to reduce the risk of leaking pipe damage. Several residents have the tool for doing that. If you do keep the water turned on, at least turn off the toilet water valve, located at the back of the toilet base. Water damage is costly! Consider "paying ahead" on the MUDD water bill that comes due while you're gone. Add a few extra dollars in case of a rate change. Credit card companies notified that you're "heading home", so they can tag any possible local unauthorized card use after your departure. **Pray** before you leave, asking for protection over your property, and for safe travels.
