

GATE REMOTES

As a reminder to those returning to the Park but who weren't here last year, effective April 1st, the "card slot" for the Park's canal entrance gate became no longer useable.

HVR residents needing "after hours" passage through the gate now require a remote, available for purchase at the Office.

Renters can also purchase the \$15 remotes and, at the end of their stay, these will be bought back for \$10.

<u>PS</u>: If you ever need to get out of the Park in the middle of the night for a medical emergency or early flight, and you don't have the means to open the gate, you can **drive over to Leisure's gate**. It automatically opens for any vehicle that slowly approaches it.

(Note: You can get out that way, but not back in.)

TO BOOK ANY PARK ACTIVITY

- 1. Pick up the appropriate request form at the front desk (or directly from the document rack on the wall).
- 2. Complete the form and return it to the activity file in the same rack.
- 3. Upon confirmation (or denial) from Board through the Activities Director, your form will be placed back in the appropriate file in the rack.

Do not just assume your activity is a "go" until you receive notification via your form being returned to the rack. Be patient. This process may take several days.

SOME FRIENDLY REMINDERS:

- There is no such thing as a "rolling stop".
 Please come to a FULL STOP at posted Park stop signs. This includes golf carts and bicycles.
- Cover the hot tub when done, no matter what time of day. Reduce heat loss / costs.
- Turn off the fans and lights, if you're the last one out the door of any HVR building. (Exceptions: lights in bathroom hallway and over the front desk of clubhouse.)
- SLOW DOWN, please. We still have too many vehicles speeding in the Park.
- There's still a lot of citrus fruit lying on the ground. It needs to be picked up often.
 Don't entice rodents, or allow potential new HVR buyers to see an unkempt Park.
- Park residents in temporary need of crutches, a cane, a rolling walker, potty chair, or wheelchair may borrow them free from the Office.
- Walk on the left side of the roads FACING traffic. Use flashlights and wear lightcolored or reflective clothing in the evening. See and be seen!
- Pick up after your pets. Non-Service Pets are not allowed in any HVR building.
- If you notice an HVR item in need of maintenance or repair, please fill out a form found on the wall by the front desk. Let's nip small repairs in the bud before they become big costly repairs. Thanks!
- If you see someone new in the Park, make an effort to introduce yourself. Find out their hobbies or interests and offer to bring and introduce them to that activity's group.

Then due to the computer chip shortage, we could not get the required replacement parts. Parts finally arrived mid- October and the locks are finally fully functional.

We owe Barb Childress, Pat Vance, and Doris Baggett a big Thank You for taking turns manually locking and unlocking the doors all summer!

For those of you that use the swimming pool, I think you will see a big change in the water quality and general appearance. Diane Tardif took on the challenge and has spent many hours getting educated about algae, filter cleaning, and keeping the correct ph-levels maintained. Thank you, Diane!

You will notice new lights in the walkway on the East (front) side of the hall. They are brighter and energy efficient. As money permits, we will be replacing all the lights around the hall walkways.

Reminder that the gate on Western Road now operates by remotes only. We have them for sale at the office for \$15, pre-programmed and ready to go!

There is also a Monthly Calendar printed which highlights "Special" or significant Activities that are happening, so that they stand out more significantly and are less likely to be missed. For examples, events such as Park meetings, fundraiser meals or a Christmas concert or ice cream social would be shown on the calendar, whereas an event which occurs each and EVERY Tuesday, for example, is in the REGULAR ACTIVITIES LIST above.

Residents can then personalize this monthly calendar by filling the day's blocks with only those events which concern or interest them. Alternately, grab a highlighter marker and mark up the above list!
