Over the summer, Barb Childress and her committee will be working on some proposed changes to address and update these inadequacies, as well as outline the proper procedures to change them. We will at some point be notifying every owner about an upcoming vote next year. Please take the time to read the proposed changes and be prepared to fill out the ballots you will receive in the Fall.

We must not only have almost all members (whose names appear on the deeds) participate in the vote, but we must also have a 66% approval from them for the changes to pass.

A synopsis of the covenant proposals can be found on page 3 of this newsletter. They are not the final wording; that will come at a later date.

On a different matter, it has been a trying year for some members getting the Park affairs restarted after being "closed" in 2020-21, and I want to thank the many Volunteers who helped to get things going once again.

Finally, on a personal note, April and I have to return north about six weeks sooner than normal, so I will leave you in the very capable hands of VP Carol Bishop-Bean and the Board. As always, I am still available by phone or email.

AMENDING HVRPOA COVENANTS

Please note: This proposal is not the final draft. Its purpose, at this early point, is solely to promote awareness and discussion.

There have been several attempts over the last few years to "update" our Covenants (which were last changed in 2006 – Filing 1580201). These attempts have failed because, unlike voting to change our Bylaws which only requires a majority of a quorum at a monthly meeting, Covenant amendments require consent of 66% of all owners listed on the deeds.

While all of the changes proposed have come from HVR members, we have been unable to get enough owners to physically vote to make these important changes. We have 468 properties in HVR. We have 750+/- eligible Covenant voters. In order to amend a Covenant, we must have at least 66% "yes" votes. In 2019, we attempted to make changes to seven Covenants. Unfortunately, only 518 of the owners voted. Over 70% of the 500+ votes were "yes" to make the changes, therefore nothing could be changed.

At this time, we believe that adjusting the percentage to pass Covenant amendments from "at least 66%" to 50% + 1 would be beneficial for the future growth of our park. While that percentage change would not go into effect until after approval of at least 66% of the owners, we would like to outline several currently proposed Covenant updates by explaining briefly why the changes are needed.

- Change 1 Section VI Paragraph 3B (add to)
 Many Casitas have been constructed
 in the park and have had to adhere to
 the restrictions outlined for sheds and
 garages building on the back 50% of
 the lot. These are small homes and
 park models that are also used as
 living quarters approved by the
 Architectual Committeee.
- Change 2 No restriction listed Section VI 3e (add)
 Allow awnings and carports to be 15' –
 not designated in current guidelines
 but requested to cover mobile homes
 and Casitas.

- Change 3 Section VI Paragraph 14

 Mail boxes are expected to conform to the subdivision standard, which is rubber. Owners would like to put up more decorative boxes with brick, stone or metal which would be approved by the Architectural Committee.
- Change 4 Section VII Sub Paragraph 5d
 Fences: Clarification of fence
 limitations and need to go through the
 Architectural Committee.
- Change 5 Section IX Paragraph 2.

 Make 50% + 1 the new threshold for amending the Covenants
- Change 6 Section X Paragraph 3
 Enforcement Standing and RemediesCovenant violations notification and potential fining if not resolved.
- Change 7 55 Plus Cov Filing 1580202

 Age restrictions gives clarification as to what is needed to keep us compliant with Federal and State laws as a 55 or over park.

Alternative Dispute Resolution Committee changes have been addressed by State regulations that supersede our Covenants.

We ask that you review your current copy of the Covenants and compare the changes proposed. Talk to friends and neighbors, or speak to a Board Member if you have questions. Form an opinon and be prepared to vote in January of 2023. Changes will be presented at the December 10,2022 meeting, showing current and proposed language for each amendment. As per new Texas law, ballots will be mailed out to all voters on Jan 3-4, 2023. Please mark and return to the office during operating hours or return in the post paid envelope provided no later that January 25. We should have results to present at the February 12, 2023 meeting.



SUMMERTIME YARD CARE

Residents are reminded that yard weeds must be kept under control. It is surprising how quickly the summertime weeds will pop up and thrive through the gravel rocks, despite the summer heat.

Please **make arrangements** with someone to check on fallen citrus fruit and maintain your Summer yard cleanup and weed control spraying as often as necessary.

Complete the office form naming your "yard care" person. Without a contact name, you run the risk of forcing the Park to have to hire someone and send you the bill.

There are some yard-care service providers within the Park. Ask around for names. Be sure to collaborate with any provider regarding what your expectations are versus their actual services.

UPDATE YOUR PROPERTY ADS

Postings of "For Sale" or "For Rent" ads for HVR Properties must be re-dated or re-written at least every 12 months or risk being removed from the hallway bulletin board. If you or someone you know has an older ad that is still valid, please redate the ad or make a new one.

Due to bulletin board space, those **ads must be no larger than 5.5" x 8"** (1/2 sheet of paper).

Posting larger ads or bending the rules by posting two half-page ads for the same location (such as one of photos and one of info) is unfair to other advertisers seeking a spot, and may result in having your ad completely removed.

<u>PENNY IN THE FREEZER</u>?

Are you planning to leave your home for a few days or week or longer and are wondering if items are safe in your freezer from a possible power outage? If you return to find your microwave clock flashing, you know your power went off, but you wouldn't know for how long.

Was it a 3 second power fluctuation or a 3 day outage causing food to thaw and then refreeze. You can't necessarily check with your neighbours, as it might have been only your own fridge or freezer "acting up".

One simple solution is to put a glass of water in the freezer. Once frozen, place a coin on top of the water before you leave.

Upon your return, check the coin. If it's still lying on top of the water, everything is ok. If the coin is at the bottom of the glass, you know you encountered a longer power outage – one that warrants throwing out that thawed-and-refrozen freezer contents.

For next year's projects, our <u>Quilting Group</u> has decided to do something different. Instead of working on a few patterns, we will be focusing on learning and improving techniques that can be adapted to a variety of projects.

Each week, we will concentrate on one specific technique and make a block using that technique. We will offer a simple example for beginners and a more challenging example for the experienced sewers. We will also show you tips to make each technique easier.

These blocks can then be combined to complete a row quilt, wall hanging, table runner, or some other project.

extra window shades to reduce curtain fading
and as furniture dust covers.
Storage of your outdoor umbrella-style
clothes dryer to prevent sun damage and heat
rotting and stretching the lines.
Bug sprayer called to annually spray around
your foundations. Termites do exist in this area!
Rat/mice pellets & traps and moth balls
placed under your skirting and on top of RV tires
to deter varmints getting in. That's cheaper than
replacing gnawed wires and hoses!
Arrangements made with someone to spray
your yard for weeds , and water your plants/trees.
Hot water heater switch flipped off. Why
heat water when you're not there?
Turn off the water supply at the curb to
reduce the risk of leaking pipe damage. Several
residents have the tool for doing that.
If you do keep the water turned on, at least
turn off the toilet water valve , located at the back
of the toilet base. Water damage is costly!
Consider "paying ahead" on the MUDD
water bill that comes due while you're gone. Add a
few extra dollars in case of a rate change.
Notify Credit card companies that you're
"heading home", so they can tag any possible
local unauthorized card use after your departure.
Pray before you leave, asking for protection
over your property, and also for safe travels.
