## **DRINK MORE WATER**

## **JANUARY BOARD ELECTIONS**

Members wishing to offer their candidacy for a Board position are reminded that the deadline is Dec 8 at 8:00 am.

Note: As per our Lawyer's clarification of Texas Law, any provision\* ..... that restricts a property owner's right to run for a board position ... is void. (\*other than having a criminal record or spouse on the board)

In other words, a Board member is not limited to one term, and can re-offer their candidacy for any position they so choose.

See TX law 209.00591 for complete & exact wording.

Note that nominations from the floor could occur at the Jan 14th membership meeting.

## **ABSENTEE vs PROXY VOTING**

If you will not be in HVR for the Jan 14<sup>th</sup> vote, consider using one of these alternate methods to cast your vote(s):

An absentee ballot is filled out by the member and must be received by the office BEFORE the meeting. These ballots count towards a quorum.

A proxy ballot does NOT count towards a quorum. A proxy form is completed/signed by a member, naming a specific other member to collect your ballots at the meeting and fill them in when voting takes place. You have to trust that your proxy will choose wisely on your behalf.

Contact the office to arrange for either type. Distribution of both types is obviously carefully monitored.

## **GARBAGE BAGS**

This is a reminder that pretty much every January 1<sup>st</sup> for the past decade, the Service Provider increases the price for a pack of five, so if you're running low on garbage bags, consider re-stocking before year's end.

Have you ever considered tipping these guys at year's end? Rain or cold, they do a great job! Leave them \$\$ or some Starbucks gift cards.

## **SOME FRIENDLY REMINDERS:**

Cover the hot tub when done (no matter what time of day) to help reduce heat loss / costs.

Turn off the fans and lights, if you're the last one out the door of any HVR building. (Exceptions: lights in bathroom hallway and over the front desk of clubhouse.)

Please observe posted speed and STOP signs throughout the Park. This includes bikes and golf carts. SLOW DOWN, esp. on Long Dr.

Pick up after your pets. Non-Service Pets are not allowed in any HVR building.

If you notice an HVR item in need of maintenance or repair, please fill out a form found on the wall by the front desk. Let's nip small repairs in the bud before they become costly repairs.

If you see someone new in the Park, make an effort to introduce yourself. Find out their hobbies or interests and offer to bring and introduce them to that activity's group.

Consider walking the dog of a less-mobile neighbor a few times a week (if not daily). All three of you will benefit from this.

If you use any Park facilities, clean it up/straighten it up when through. Leave it looking better than when you walked in.

Gate remotes are available at the Office (\$15).

Pick up any citrus fruit lying on the ground. It needs to be picked up often, so as not to entice rodents, or allow potential HVR buyers or renters to see an unkempt Park.

Walk on the left side of the street, facing traffic.

Use single file when cars are approaching.

Don't let your young grandkids drive your golf cart.

## **AMENDING HVRPOA COVENANTS**

The HVR covenants were written many years ago by the builders of the Park. At that time, they were adequate. However, over the years some Texas laws have changed, as have the needs of our membership. This in turn has made some of the covenants inadequate, if not unlawful.

For those reasons, it is necessary to present some proposed changes to address and update these inadequacies and illegal laws.

There are 8 proposed changes:

- Change 1 concerns change in size of Casitas
- Change 2 concerns change in heights of awnings
- Change 3 concerns storage of cargo trailers
- Change 4 concerns change in allowable mailboxes
- Change 5 concerns new structure tiedown requirements
- Change 6 concerns corner lot fencing
- Change 7 concerns changing minimum covenant vote requirement
- Change 8 concerns enforcement of Park non-compliance fines

Full proposals are posted in the Hall and/or on the website. Speak to a Board Member if you have questions.

Voting for these changes does NOT take place at any Park meeting. As per new Texas law, ballots will be sent out to all voters early in Jan, 2023. Please mark and return ballots to the office during operating hours or return in the provided postpaid envelope no later than January 25th.

We should have results to present at the February 12, 2023 meeting, if not sooner.

### **BYLAW & COVENANT REMINDERS**

It appears that the Covenant Section VI is full of frequently violated rules. The following list is not complete but does represent some of the more common violations.

- You have more than two pets at your property.
- You do not control your dog(s) barking outside at your lot.
- You do not pick up after your pet(s).
- You have a satellite or internet dish or antenna on the front 50% of your roof.
- You do not take care of your yard (weeds & fallen citrus) in a timely regular manner.

Familiarize yourself with both documents: HVRPOA Covenants and HVRPOA Bylaws, and **please willingly make any necessary adjustments to comply with them.**
