Jack Martin 1926- 2022

The man with the vision to build HVR and the other 7 sister Parks passed away Dec 6, 2022.

REMEMBERING JACK MARTIN

As a tribute, we are reprinting portions of a previously printed newsletter article (from 2017) featuring interviews with some of HVR's "early settlers" and their fond dealings with Mr. Martin:

Ken (& Jan) Steinhoff: In January of 1997, HVR was basically a field with pegs marking off the streets. The Clubhouse was unfinished and there was only a hole in the ground for the pool. But by Fall, there were about 50 families and we held Park meetings with Jack present every Saturday.

Joe (& Shirley) Carpenter: Because we had no street addresses (only lot #s.), it was a hassle to get power hook-ups. Jack at least turned on my water so I could wet my new concrete.

Vern (& Jan) McClish: Mr. Martin was showing us what would become our lot (corner of Long & Bunker) when a rather crabby lady approached us with apparently yet another complaint. She asked Jack if he could guarantee her that no lean-to's or sheds would be built in the Park. Jack replied that no he couldn't guarantee that, but he could guarantee that she seemed to be the type of person he didn't want in this park. He told her to go to his office and get her deposit back.

I did a lot of the water and electrical connections for Jack, and Jan would often run up to the clubhouse to deliver messages to the builders from Jack, since cellphones weren't common then. George (& Marion) Grothe: Mr. Martin was at our first club house meeting. He wanted to start the meeting so I shouted, "Quiet." Impressed with my military voice, Jack turned to me and said, "You should be President.", and so I was.

Many of us never met the man personally, but only know him as "the older man often seen" slowly driving through the Park in his pickup truck.

A Celebration of Life for Mr. Martin was held at LVR Dec 12th. The Hall was deservedly packed!

HVRPOA FEES OVERDUE?

With everything else going on during the busy Holiday Season, did you forgot to pay your HVR owner's yearly \$300 HVRPOA fees? If so, this is a friendly reminder that it's probably now overdue. Yes, the deadline was January 2nd.

Checks made out to *Hidden Valley Ranch* should include your lot number(s). Direct deposits or bank transfers are not accepted.

BYLAW/COVENANT REMINDERS

It appears that the Covenant Section VI is full of frequently violated rules. The following list is not complete but does represent some of the more common violations.

You are in violation of HVR Park laws if:

- You have more than a single family (1 generation) living at your property.
- You have more than two pets at your property.
 - You do not control your dog(s) barking outside at your lot.
- You do not pick up after your pet(s).
 You have a satellite or internet dish or antenna on the front 50% of your roof.
- You do not take care of your yard (weeds & fallen citrus) in a timely regular manner.

Familiarize yourself with both the HVRPOA Covenants and HVRPOA Bylaws, and please willingly make any necessary adjustments to comply with them.

<u>UPDATE ON COVENANT AMENDMENTS</u>

The proposed 8 covenant/bylaw changes (as listed in the last newsletter issue) has been put on the back burner for now.

The preparation for the required voting procedure did not fall into place as quickly as originally planned in order to be ready to hold a January mail-in vote as was previously planned.
