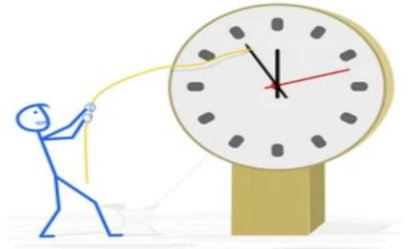

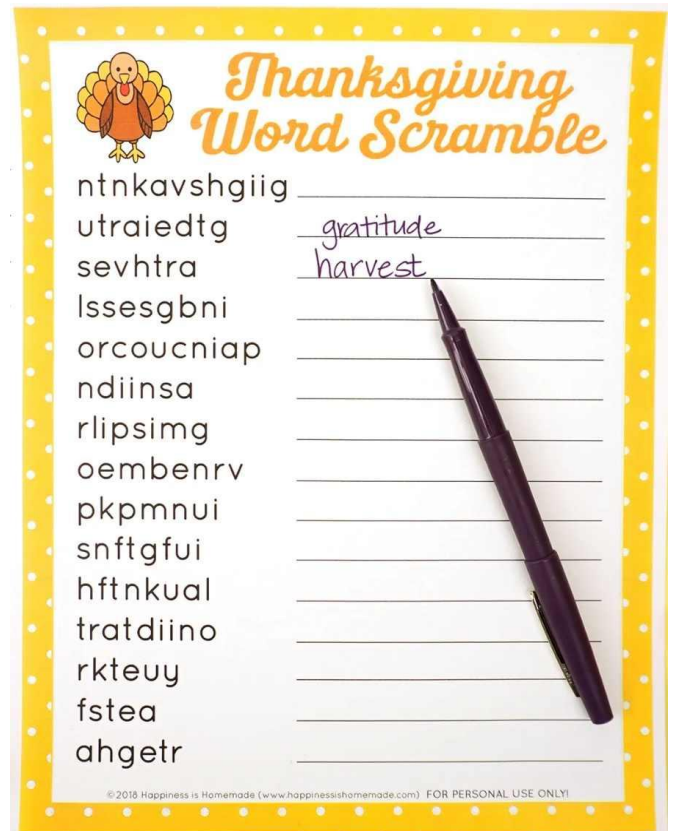
THOUGHTS FOR THANKSGIVING

Re: PARK COVENANTS

Recent changes in Texas Laws will require corresponding changes to SOME of our Covenants. Those updated covenants affected by the new State laws will require voting (by mail).

The necessary covenant changes and a verified voting list are currently being prepared. Look for details on the proposed changes and the voting procedure in December's newsletter.

Please note however, **the majority of HVR's covenants are still intact.** HVR owners are reminded they must abide by these Park Covenants (which are posted on our website).

Here's one covenant in particular offered as a reminder for those making changes versus repairs to their property following last April's windstorm:

Section 6 Lot Restrictions Par. 3

a. Every building, structure, dwelling or other improvement which is construed or placed on any lot in said subdivision shall comply with all applicable laws, ordinances, building codes, rules and regulations and must be approved by the Architectural Committee prior to construction and/or alteration. The Architectural Committee shall review plot plans, quality of workmanship and material, with harmony of exterior design and suitability of location in mind. A copy of the approved plot plan should be conspicuously displayed at the construction site prior to ground breaking.

No service fees, but photo ID is required.

GATE REMOTES

HVR residents and renters needing "after hours" passage through the HVR gate require a remote, available at the Office (\$17.50).

PS: If you ever need to get out of the Park in the middle of the night for a medical emergency or early flight, and you don't have the means to open the gate, you can **drive over to Leisure's gate**. It automatically opens for any vehicle that slowly approaches it.

(Note: You can get out that way, but not back in.)

OIL CHANGE INSTRUCTIONS

For women:

1. Drive to dealership. Relax in the waiting room with a complementary cup of coffee.
2. Forty-five minutes later, scan debit card and leave in your properly maintained vehicle.

Money spent: Oil change: \$60

For men:

1. Drive past dealership on way to Walmart to buy oil, filter, drain pan, kitty litter, hand cleaner, and beer.
2. Back home, first open a beer and drink it.
3. Spend 45 minutes looking for jack rest stands. Finally find them behind garbage bins. In frustration, open another beer. Jack up the truck.
4. Place drain pan under engine. Look for proper 9/16" wrench for 15 min. Give up and use crescent wrench.
5. Unscrew drain plug, which drops into pan of draining hot oil, splashing some onto your arms and face. Cuss.

9. Install new oil filter. Pour first quart of fresh oil into engine.

HOA FEE INCREASE

After a special meeting of the HVRPOA Board on Oct 16th, the annual Park HOA fee has been increased from \$300 to \$350. This is the first increase since 2009, and will go towards major maintenance needs in the next year or two. These hefty-priced repairs include a new roof on the annex building, resealing the Hall roof and replacing its aging AC units, and remodeling the Hall restrooms to bring them up to new Texas code standards.

2024 fees are due on or before Jan 2nd.

KEEPING THE PARK SHIP-SHAPE

If you use any Park facilities, please clean it up / straighten it up when you're through. Leave it looking better than when you walked in!

If you notice an HVR item in need of maintenance or repair, please fill out a form found on the wall by the front desk. Let's fix small repairs before they become big repairs. Thanks!

KEEPING YOUR LOT SHIP-SHAPE

Residents are reminded that yard weeds must be kept under control. It is surprising how quickly the weeds will pop up and thrive through the gravel rocks, despite the heat or lack of water.

As well, be diligent in collecting fallen citrus fruit to deter snakes and rodents. This may require ground pickup as often as twice a week.

If you're not yet here (or won't be) for the Season, please **make arrangements with someone** to check on fallen citrus fruit and to maintain your yard cleanup and weed control spraying as often as necessary. Be sure to collaborate with any provider regarding what your expectations are versus their actual services.

The office should be aware of the contact info for this cleanup person. Otherwise, you run the risk of forcing the Park to have to hire someone and send you the bill.

Let's keep the Park looking fresh and clean for other owners, visitors and potential buyers alike.

THE GOOD AND THE BAD

The good: Watermelon

Watermelon is indisputably a flavorful and nutrient-packed fruit. Now, new research further illuminates its vital role in boosting dietary quality and supporting heart health.

According to the study, consuming watermelon helps the body to better absorb the nutrients of fiber, potassium, vitamin C, lycopene and other carotenoids found in other foods, while lowering the absorption of added sugars and saturated fatty acids. The bad: cans from unboxed beverages (It's the cans themselves, not their contents)

Health awareness has been issued after the recent deaths of two persons in another State from leptospirosis. The unboxed cans were/are stored in warehouses and then on store shelves, and the infective organism leptospirai (within dried mice urine) was found on the tops of the cans.

A subsequent cross-country study showed that **tops of many beverage cans are contaminated** more than we'd like to think or believe!

So, wash and wipe all the tops of your beverage cans before placing in the fridge and/or before opening and putting them to your lips.
