ABSENTEE vs PROXY VOTING

If you will not be in HVR for the Jan 13th vote, consider using one of these alternate methods to cast your vote(s):

<u>An absentee ballot</u> is filled out by the member and must be received by the office BEFORE the meeting. These ballots count towards a quorum.

<u>A proxy ballot</u> does NOT count towards a quorum. A proxy form is completed/signed by a member, naming a specific other member to collect your ballots at the meeting and fill them in when voting takes place. You have to trust that your proxy will choose wisely on your behalf.

Contact the office to arrange for either type of ballot. Distribution of both types of ballot is obviously carefully monitored.

GATE REMOTES

Gate remotes are available to HVR residents and renters needing "after hours" passage through the HVR gate. Available at the Office (\$17.50).

PS: If you ever need to get out of the Park in the middle of the night for a medical emergency or early flight, and you don't have the means to open the gate, you can **drive over to Leisure's gate**. It automatically opens for any vehicle that slowly approaches it.

(Note: You can get out that way, but not back in.)

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

We can't have all the activities that happen in our Park without help from volunteers. Their involvement is much appreciated.

Having said that, we need more people to step up to the plate and help out. There's big and small tasks from which you can choose. Some tasks require as little as 15-20 minutes once a week or maybe an hour once a month (for example, setting up Craft Fair tables).

We appreciate Renters who volunteer, too.

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED FOR AUDIT AND INVENTORY COUNT

A few volunteers are needed to do the annual <u>audit</u> and also the <u>inventory count</u> before year's end. If you are interested in helping out with either task, there is a sign-up sheet in the Clubhouse. Sign up asap as volunteers must be approved by membership at the December meeting.

GARBAGE BAGS

This is a reminder that pretty much every January 1st for the past decade, the Service Provider increases the price for a pack of five, so if you're running low on garbage bags, consider re-stocking at 5/\$11.90 before year's end. (Remember: it's the SERVICE you're buying through this purchase.)

Have you ever considered tipping the workers at year's end? Rain or cold, they do a great job! Leave them \$\$ or some Starbucks gift cards.

AMENDING HVRPOA COVENANTS

The HVR covenants were written many years ago by the builders of the Park. At that time, these were adequate, but now some of these do not reflect member's changing needs. As one example, the awning height restriction is inadequate for the new taller fifth-wheel models.

As well, recent changes in Texas Laws requires corresponding changes be made to those affected – and now unlawful - covenants.

There are currently 7 proposed changes:

- Change 1 concerns change in size of Casitas
- Change 2 concerns change in heights of awnings
- Change 3 concerns storage of cargo trailers
- Change 4 concerns change in allowable mailboxes
- Change 5 concerns new structure tiedown requirements
- Change 6 concerns changing minimum covenant vote requirement
- Change 7 concerns enforcement of Park noncompliance fines

Full proposals are posted in the Hall and/or on the website. Speak to a Board Member if you have questions or concerns.

As per new Texas law, voting for these changes does <u>NOT</u> take place at any Park meeting. Ballots will be sent out to all voters early in the new year. - Barbara Childress

HVRPOA ASSESSMENT INCREASE

After a special meeting of the HVRPOA Board on Oct 16th, the annual Park POA fee has been increased from \$300 to \$350. This is the first increase since 2009, and will go towards major maintenance needs in the next year or two. These hefty-priced repairs include a new roof on the annex building, resealing the Hall roof and replacing its aging AC units, and remodeling the Hall restrooms to bring them up to new Texas code standards.

2024 fees are due on or before Jan 2nd. The Office will accept either cash payments or checks made out to *Hidden Valley Ranch*. Sorry, no direct deposits or bank transfers are accepted.

Be sure to include your lot number(s) with the payment, preferably written right on the check.

BYLAW & COVENANT REMINDERS

The Covenant Section VI has rules that are frequently being broken by owners. The following list is not complete but does represent some of the more common violations:

You are in violation of HVR Park laws if:

- You have more than a single family (1) generation) living at your property
- You have more than two pets at your property.
- You do not control your dog(s) barking outside at your lot.
- You do not pick up after your pet(s).
- You have a satellite or internet dish or antenna on the front 50% of your roof.
- You do not take care of your yard (weeds & fallen citrus) in a timely regular manner.

Familiarize yourself with both documents: HVRPOA Covenants and HVRPOA Bylaws, and please willingly make any necessary adjustments to comply with them.
