ST. VALENTINE'S DAY INFORMATION

Lupercalia, from the Europe nations, survived the initial rise of Christianity but was outlawed—as it was deemed "un-Christian"–at the end of the 5th century, when Pope Gelasius de-

clared February 14 St. Valentine's Day. It was not until much later, however, that the day became definitively associated with love. During the Middle Ages, it was commonly believed in France and England that February 14 was the beginning of birds'



mating season, which added to the idea that the middle of Valentine's Day should be a day for romance.

Valentine greetings were popular as far back as the Middle Ages, though written Valentine's didn't begin to appear until after 1400.

In addition to the United States, Valentine's Day is celebrated in Canada, Mexico, the United Kingdom, France and Australia. In Great Britain, Valentine's Day began to be popularly celebrated around the 17th century. By the middle of the 18th, it was common for friends and lovers of all social classes to exchange small tokens of affection or handwritten notes, and by 1900 printed cards began to replace written letters due to improvements in printing technology. Readymade cards were an easy way for people to express their emotions in a time when direct expression of one's feelings was discouraged.

Americans probably began exchanging hand-made valentines in the early 1700s. In the

1840s, Esther A. Howland began selling the first mass-produced valentines in America. Howland, known as the "Mother of the Valentine," made elaborate creations with real lace, ribbons and colorful pictures known as "scrap." Today,

according to the Greeting Card Association, an estimated 1 billion Valentine's Day cards are sent

Washington's Birthday & President's Day Holidays

Like Independence Day, Presidents' Day is traditionally viewed as a time of patriotic celebration and remembrance. In its original incarnation as Washington's Birthday, the holiday gained special meaning during the difficulties of the Great Depression, when portraits of George Washington often graced the front pages of newspapers and magazines every February 22. In 1932 the date was used to reinstate the Purple Heart, a military decoration originally created by George Washington to honor soldiers killed or wounded while serving in the armed forces.

Patriotic groups and the Boy Scouts of America also held celebrations on the day, and in 1938 some 5,000 people attended mass at Saint Patrick's Cathedral in New York City in honor of Washington.

In its modern form, Presidents' Day is used by many patriotic and historical groups as

a date for staging celebrations, reenactments and other events. A number of states also require that their public schools spend the days leading up to



Presidents' Day teaching students about the accomplishments of the presidents, often with a focus on the lives of Washington and Lincoln.

For its part, the federal government has held fast to the original incarnation of the holiday as a celebration of the country's first president. The third Monday in February is still listed on official calendars as Washington's Birthday.

Jam Session Info as found at Wikipedia

In the Early days a jam session per Wikipedia, was a relatively informal musical event, process, or activity where musicians, typically instrumentalists, play improvised solos and vamp on tunes, songs and chord progressions. To "jam" is to improvise music without extensive preparation or predefined arrangements, except for when the group is playing well-known jazz standards or covers of existing popular songs.

Original jam sessions, also 'free flow sessions', are often used by musicians to develop new material (music) and find suitable arrangements. Both styles can be used simply as a social gathering and communal practice session. Jam sessions may be based upon existing songs or forms, may be loosely based on an agreed chord progression or chart suggested by one participant, or may be wholly improvisational.

Jam sessions can range from very loose gatherings of amateurs to evenings where a jam session coordinator or host acts as a "gatekeeper" to ensure that only appropriate-level performers take the stage, to sophisticated improvised recording sessions by professionals which are intended to be broadcast live on radio or TV or edited and released to the public.

In today's world-

Most Jams in the Rio Grande Valley are closer related to either Classic Country, New Country, Bluegrass, 50s/60s Rock & Roll, Mountain Music, Soul as well as Jazz, Popular, Blues, Big Band and possibly others that I can't think of at this moment. Today's Jams include groups of listeners as well as musicians and singers. All seem to have barrels of fun whatever the type of music.

Today's Jams are dedicated basically to the Musician but are also dedicated to all Jammers as well as to the listener. I believe the basic rules of the Jam have more than likely been handed down from the past. Every performer – however classified – is here to enjoy what they like to do. Leaders of Jams make every effort to make sure that all Jammers, who are attending a specific Jam, get their turn to perform to the best of their
